Now, I have started my new role as an assistant principal at Hikmet Kozan Middle School for the 2024-25 academic year.


I wish everyone a successful school year ahead and am very excited for what lies ahead!

October 29, 1923, marks a pivotal moment in Turkish history: the day the Republic of Turkey was officially proclaimed. This transition from the Ottoman Empire to a modern republic symbolizes the culmination of years of struggle for independence and national sovereignty. Understanding the significance of this date requires examining both its historical context and its lasting impact on contemporary Turkey.

Mustafa Kemal Atatürk emerged as a prominent leader in the Turkish War of Independence (1919-1923). He rallied the nation, advocating for a sovereign state free from foreign domination. The successful conclusion of this war led to the abolition of the sultanate and set the stage for the establishment of a republic.

One of Van Gogh's most famous works, Wheat Field and Crows is often referred to as his "last painting" because it was painted in the last few weeks of his life. For this reason, it is interpreted by many sources as a "suicide note" submitted by the painter just before his death, Van Gogh, who was hospitalized in a sanatorium in Saint-Remy in southern France after mental distress (see. The Starry Night, Self-Portrait with Bandaged Ear, Bedroom in Arles, Van Gogh's last two months there saw the most severe relapse of his illness. In May 1890, Van Gogh left the sanatorium and moved to Auvers-sur-Oise, near Paris, to be under the supervision of Dr. Gachet and to live closer to his brother Theo. However, he would not live in this city for long and within 3 months, at the end of July, he would end his life by committing suicide. It is believed that The Wheat Field and the Crows contains many dark and depressive elements because it is considered to be his last work. The wheat field, which occupies two-thirds of the work, is divided into two separate parts by three paths through yellow ears of wheat that seem to flutter in the wind. The paths are in contrasting shades of red-brown and green, and it is quite ambiguous where the paths on the right start and go, and what purpose they serve. On the other hand, the path through the middle of the fields seems to be aimlessly cut off at some point in the future and leads nowhere. These aimless and interrupted paths are confusing and evoke an inevitable dead end.

In contrast to the vivid yellow color of the wheat field, the sky is blue, navy blue and black, creating a rather pessimistic effect. The gloomy and stormy sky and the undulating wheat field turn into images evoking a pessimistic and troubled mood with the effect of the ominous crows rising from the field. With the effect of the roads with no end in sight, the viewer is left with the feeling of being in a dead end and being alone and helpless against the approaching storm. While all these elements may refer to Van Gogh's volatile mood, they may also be indicative of his lonely and introverted state at the end of his life. According to many interpretations, the dark sky inviting the storm and the crows are direct indicators of Van Gogh's last days and his giving up on life. However, according to many different interpretations, the work is actually not as negative as one might think, and Van Gogh has created a peaceful composition of elements, each of which is appreciated individually. The vast wheat field, the empty roads, the crows flying overhead and the dark sky create a turbulent and wild atmosphere, but it is also capable of evoking silence and serenity.



First of all, wheat fields - with their yellow color - were one of Van Gogh's favorite landscapes. It is possible that the painter, who used wheat fields as the subject of many of his works, set out with the same intention this time and painted a peaceful yellow field stretching to the horizon. On the other hand, although it is not clear where the roads lead or whether they end or not, it is obvious that they could serve as an exit from the work - and therefore from the pessimistic mood - and contribute to the deep structure of the work that extends to the horizon. Stormy skies are again one of Van Gogh's favorites, and for him the turbulent skies have a serious visual quality and a strong artistic potential.

The crows flying in different directions cause the work to be interpreted in different ways. The fact that the crows are flying towards the painter - that is, towards the viewer - creates a pessimistic impression in general, while the fact that the crows are flying into the painting, that is, out of the field, creates an effect of relief and relaxation. However, since it is not clear which way these birds fly, the positive or negative interpretation does not gain clarity and does not directly contribute to the interpretation of the work.

On the other hand, although crows are widely believed to be ominous birds that herald death, it is certain that a painter like Van Gogh, who was a keen observer of nature, would not have been prejudiced against them - in fact, he himself expressed his interest in crows in his writings. The elements of the work can be interpreted differently, individually and together. If Van Gogh wanted to convey on canvas his troubled and volatile state of mind, his mental anguish, his loneliness and his abandonment of the world, he did so very successfully. The empty field in front of him,

The crows taking off, dead-end roads and stormy dark skies have a claustrophobic effect, trapping one in a nightmare of loneliness.

On the other hand, a different interpretation might suggest that the painter still harbored hope for the recovery of his illness, that he found associations of freedom, relief and lightness in the vastness of his beloved yellow wheat fields stretching to the horizon, in the roads leading forward, in the mystery of the stormy weather he loved, and in the birds taking to the air. Perhaps Van Gogh simply painted what he felt or saw without much thought. How the work will be interpreted and what effect it will have is up to the viewer.

Its founding purpose was explained as defeating non-Turkish teams. So far, it has become the Super League champion 24 times, won the Turkish Cup 18 times and the Super Cup 17 times; It also won the UEFA Cup and UEFA Super Cup in 2000. Galatasaray was also ranked as the best team in August 2000 in the "World's best football clubs" statistical study conducted by the International Federation of Football History and Statistics.8 In January 2001, it ranked first in the points rankings and became the leader of the month. After finishing the UEFA Champions League groups in 3rd place in the 1999-00 season, Galatasaray is the only team to win the UEFA Cup without being defeated. In 1999-2000, it became the first and only Turkish football club to win a European Cup by beating England's Arsenal club 4-1 on penalties in the UEFA Cup final. Galatasaray the same year; They also won the Super Cup by beating Real Madrid 2-1.


Today, we will talk about the "Autism".




